LIEUT. DONALD SCHMIDT KILLED IN SOUTH VIET NAM

Lieut. Donald Schmidt, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Schmidt of Nottawa, and husband of Virginia Schmidt, also of Nottawa, was killed in South Viet Nam in a presumed ambush, the family here receiving the terrible news Sunday night.

Lieut. Schmidt was a member of the Green Berets Special Forces, trained in everything, as the publicity about that arm of the fighting men describes it.

Donald had been in South Viet Nam for some time, and his death is a shock to all who know him. His body will be sent home for burial.

This is bringing the Viet Nam war very close to home. We have several Isabella County young men over there now.

The family has the deepest sympathy of the entire community.

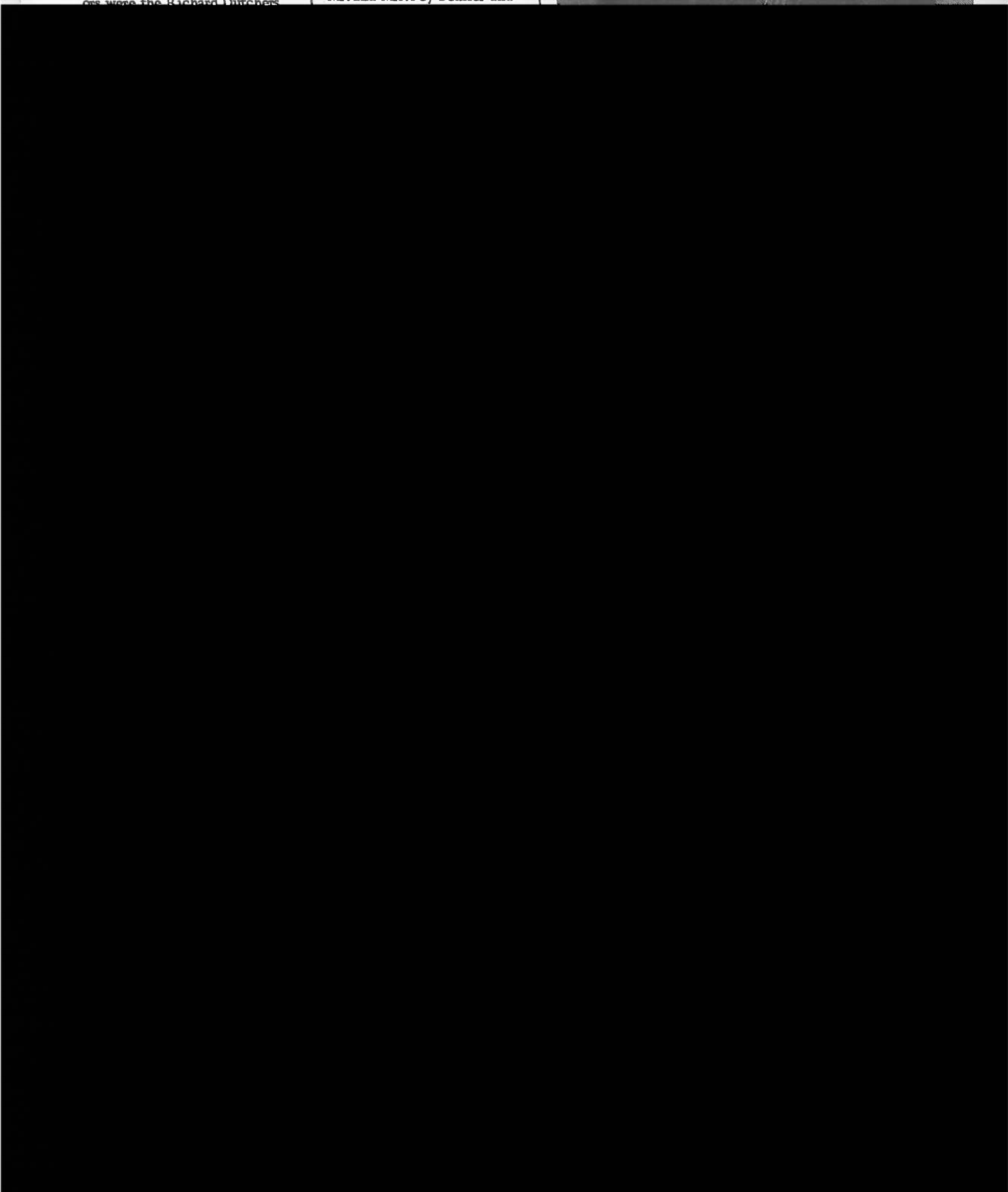

Thirty-five percent pay for their own clothes, she learned, 49 percent are allowed out any night during the week, with 12 percent not allowed out, period.

Thirty-five percent save money regularly, 51 percent have jobs outside the home. Only five percent have allowances, her survey showed.
